Workshop on Mental Disability & Nursing Care

Workshop on Mental Disability & Nursing Care was held at Hotel Bell, Madurai on 28.11.2008 which was organized by us in collaboration with DATA & N.S.S. Madurai Kamaraj University, Madurai to train the nursing students about various aspects of Mental retardation and to handle them scientifically and properly. The following objectives were set for them.i) To impart fundamentals of Mental Retardation ii)To help them in identification & screening of such person iii)To equip them to handle such children effectively and ways of providing nursing care.The following experts handle the sessions. I) Dr.V.Neethi arasu(Neurologist) ii) Dr.Sudha Deep (Obstetricians& Gynecologist) and iii) Mr.R.Ravikumar(Special Educator).Subjects taught : a) Mental disability – an overview (Meaning, Nature, Types & Characteristics b). Neurological problems of Mental Disability c)Training options for various age group of children with mental disability d) Ways of management & role of nurses in caring the children with mental disability.

150 students participated from various nursing colleges. The workshop was concluded with the remarks by Prof.S.Raju, Coordinator, NSS, Madurai Kamaraj University and Dr.V.Pugalagiri Vadamalayan, Managing Director, Vadamalyan Hospitals, Madurai.
